Student Accident Insurance

As a school we do as much as we can to protect and care for injured students, including first aid, notifying parents and emergency contacts if students are injured or hurt, and if necessary, an ambulance is called. Parents and guardians are generally responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs. Most medical costs will be refunded by Medicare. If you are a member of an ambulance or health insurance fund, you may also be able to claim transport or other expenses from that fund. The Department of Education and Training does not hold accident insurance for school students. Reasonably low-cost accident insurance policies are available from the commercial insurance sector and these can be obtained by parents for their children.

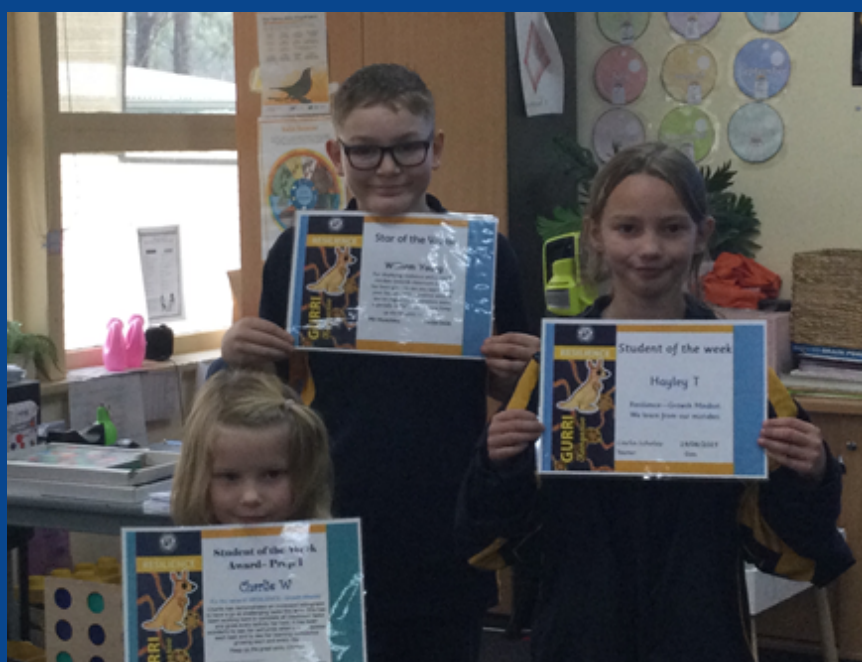

Early Help Support at Our School

What is Early Help?

Early Help is a short-term, early intervention program that supports families who may be experiencing challenges or changes in their lives. It is designed for families who would benefit from some extra support before concerns become more serious.

Early Help can assist with:

- Parenting support and strategies
- Managing children's behaviour and routines
- Strengthening family relationships
- Support during separation or family changes
- Connecting families with local services and community programs
- Assistance with school engagement and attendance
- Linking families to counselling, health, or financial support services.
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The program is available for families with children from birth to 18 years of age who are connected to a universal service (such as school or kindergarten).
