






#### HOME READING

get their Golden Time also increases responsibility.








Examples of bricks vs pavers.

#### **Easter Raffle**






Raffle is being conducted again this year. Donations of Easter items are now being sought. Please drop your donation into the school's office.

#### World Down Syndrome Day

#### Friday March 21st 2025

On this day, we ask that your child wear socks of their choice to school. They can be bright, colourful, short or long, the choice is endless! The idea behind the Lots of Socks initiative is that all types, shapes and sizes of the same thing can be unique in their own way, and yet do the same thing. Everyone understands what socks are, how they look and what they are for, and that no two socks are the same

Down syndrome is a genetic condition – it is not an illness or disease. It occurs because of an extra chromosome. People with Down syndrome have 47 chromosomes in their cells instead of 46. Down syndrome is usually recognisable at birth and confirmed by a blood test. It was named after Dr John Langdon Down who first described it. Although we know how Down syndrome happens, we do not yet know why it happens. Down syndrome occurs at conception, across all ethnic and social groups and to parents of all ages. It is nobody's fault, there is no cure and it does not go away. (DSV)

#### Smile Squad oral health packs

All children deserve a healthy smile, and the Smile Squad free school dental program is working hard to help make sure this happens.

Your child(ren) has received a free oral health pack to bring home today. The pack contains a toothbrush, full sized toothpaste, and an oral health brochure. Please take the time to read the brochure. It's full of helpful hints and tips to help your whole family eat well, drink well and clean well – for life.

#### Standard strength toothpaste

Smile Squad provides standard strength fluoride toothpaste that is generally used by ages six and over, unless recommended by a dental or trained health professional.

If your child is under six, please talk to a dental or trained health professional to find out if your child might benefit from using this toothpaste. You can also choose to put the toothpaste away until they turn six or give it to someone else in your family to use.

#### Do I need to attend my child's appointment?

No, you do not need to attend your child's appointment. You can attend if you would like to, and you can take your child to the community dental clinic if you prefer.

## HAND DRAWN PAVER

#### **ENGRAVING DETAILS**

#### PLEASE FOLLOW THESE SIMPLE STEPS WHEN CREATING YOUR IMAGE.

- 1. ONE NAME PER PAVER.
- 2. Draw your image using a good quality medium thickness black marker pen (about 2mm thick). eg Artline 70 'High Performance' marker. Do not use a ballpoint pen, coloured texta or pencils!
- 3. Make sure you rub out any pencil lines as these will show up on the finished paver.
- Do not include computer-generated or pasted pictures.
   The hand drawn image engraving process is set up to engrave hand drawn images only.
